## State flag for submarine to pass through county

The state flag will visit Forsyth County this week as part of the Georgia Flag Project.

A public ceremony is scheduled for 1 p.m. Wednesday in front of the Forsyth County Administration Building. The USS Georgia Return to

Service Committee coordinated the project. The 560-foot-long submarine is returning to service with new capabilities.

The flag is traveling through all of Georgia's 159 counties and will be presented to Gov. Sonny Perdue on March 28 during the Return to Service Ceremony at the Naval Submarine Base Kings Bay.
